

Discovering the First World War: Study Workshop at the University of Kent

Students from the hub schools will listen to a 40 minute lecture, given by an historian from the Gateways to the First World War project, which will give an overview of the conflict of 1914-1918. This will provide the historical context of the war both at home and abroad, and begin to draw out some themes in relation to the subjects the schools have chosen to study in further detail. After the lecture there will be a question and answer session, so the students might want to consider some questions to ask before the day itself. The second part of the event will take an interactive workshop format and be designed around sources relevant to each hub school's chosen focus. The aim of the day is to widen the student's knowledge of the war in terms of its domestic and international reach, while at the same time encouraging them to consider less well known aspects of the conflict and helping them to delve deeper into their own individual projects.
