in the FIRST WORLD WAR

Almost a century after the end of the First World War (WW1), many questions regarding this conflict remain unanswered. Consolidated statistics, such as the number of military victims, present several obscurities on closer inspection. The total number of military and civilian casualties in World War I were about 40 million: estimates range from 15 to 19 million deaths and about 23 million wounded military personnel. The staggering numbers include many thousands of Italians.
